<b>Policy Statement</b>				
<b>Purpose</b>	This Policy specifies the principles for managing and supporting student progress in a program of study including academic progression, recognition of prior learning and course enrolment.			
<b>Scope</b>	<p>The progression and recognition of prior learning elements of this Policy apply to all coursework programs, offered by or on behalf of UNSW, and students enrolled in these programs.</p> <p>The enrolment elements of this Policy apply to all courses within coursework programs, coursework components of Higher Degree Research programs and non-award courses offered by or on behalf of UNSW, and students enrolled in these courses.</p>

## 1. Overview

Academic progression is the process by which a student advances in their program of study, through progressively meeting the academic and administrative requirements for the program.

The status of a student's progress towards meeting the requirements for their program is called Academic Standing and is determined at the end of each standard semester (Semester 1 and Semester 2). Academic Standing is not calculated for students studying for a higher degree by research.

Maintaining satisfactory academic progress is important as it indicates that a student is achieving the learning outcomes for each stage of their program and is on track to complete the program.

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
